
Good luck to all Scots Guardsmen and we look forward to the presence of HRH The Duke of Edinburgh on parade as our Colonel.

Note: After the close of the formal Armed Forces Day event in St Andrew Square the Scots Guards Club will be available as part of its first Centenary Open Weekend.



SCOTS GUARDS MEMORIAL PROJECT

A reminder that the Scots Guards Memorial Project is live on the Scots Guards website <u>https://scotsguards.org/history/the-memo-rial-project/#</u>, it is fairly easy to use. As part of the work of the Regimental Historical Committee the project was tasked with setting up a computer database to record memorials across the World that have been constructed to remember Scots Guardsmen in both war and peace. To date we currently have 380 Memorials listed and 927 Scots Guardsmen. We are looking for:

- Large or small memorials to single Scots Guardsmen, detachments or Battalions, from times long past until the present day.
- The memorial could be anything from plaques to stained glass windows in churches, to trees of remembrance, in fact anything which in the respectful memory of our officers or Guardsmen.
- The names of Scots Guardsmen killed and listed on local town or village war memorials.
- Headstones of graves in UK or abroad which record service in the Scots Guards, but please not those men buried in Commonwealth War Graves Commission Cemeteries because they are listed comprehensively by that organisation.

While you are out on your travels across the UK and beyond keep a look out for memorials to Scots Guardsmen.

Fellow Scots Guardsmen,

The message of what we provide as a Regiment in the way of welfare to Scots Guardsmen, past and present, including their families who are in need, has not reached all areas of our community. This note is intended to fill the information gaps in the What, Why and when regarding welfare support and benevolence.

There are two primary points of contact for welfare in the Scots Guards, they are:

- The Unit Welfare Officer (UWO). He and his small team deal with all serving personnel and their families. The UWO duty mobile is 0777 324 0200.
- The Regimental Welfare & Finance Officer (RW&FO). I deal with all those who no longer serve and their families, my contact details are:
 - E Mail <u>finance@scotsguards.org</u>
 - Mobile 0300 154 0159 (If I don't answer then leave a message and a contact number on my answer machine and I will call you back)

Today, we are registered with, and follow the statement of recommended practice required by the following organisations:

- Companies House.
- Charity Commission of England and Wales.
- The Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator.

We do this by using independent auditors to prepare detailed accounts showing who we are, what we do and how we deliver benevolence support to the Scots Guards family. In addition, we work alongside COBSEO who group all the military charities together and provide an effective IT platform for us all to communicate in a safe and secure environment.

The following agencies, Soldiers, Sailors, Airman and Families association (SSAFA), The Royal British Legion (TRBL) and Poppy Scotland (PS) provide our front-line case workers, they are extremely professional in what they do, their knowledge of the benefit system and finding routes for support through many broken areas within the community are amazing.


It is worthy of note that the basic principle applied to all cases presented is do they need it, or just want it. Those in need will be supported by our front-line case workers, and to ensure that we maintain within the Law, strict procedures are followed. Welfare support is not easy and short cuts lead to mistakes when practices are ignored or curtailed. The provision of quick fixes of cash, seldom addresses the problem and it is remiss of me not to provide a platform for further discussions and support to take place. One of the many exam questions proposed recently was "will the Scots Guards pay for transport to funerals". The quick response to this depends on the following:


- If this is a need, then time must be allowed for a nominated case worker to assess and discuss the requirement in a safe and comfortable environment. There may be other issues not identified initially that are affecting their current position.
- Urgent Cases, where case workers will hinder the immediate position are dealt directly by myself.
- If this is a want, then appropriate advice will be offered.

The question of what we provide as evidence for benevolence support can be found from the below report, which is briefed in detail at the Scots Guards Association Annual General Meeting, it also appears in the annualRegimentalMagazine and the Scots Guards Association Newsletter:

Welfare report for the year ending 31st March 2024.

This year we have provided benevolence grants to 72 Scots Guardsmen and their families totalling £115,440, with the exception of the previous year which included the winter fuel grant to all our Married LCpls and Gdsm is slightly above the 5-year average. The charity has given grants to the sum of £37,533.1 and sought assistance from 12 other charities who generously gave £77,906.9 in grants.

It is incumbent on us all to play our part by looking out for each other and identify Scots Guardsmen who are in need, and I thank you all for your continued support in doing this.

I hope this note has filled the gaps to many questions or discussions that have or are taking place, if not then please contact me and we can discuss your issue in more detail, or alternatively you can pop in and visit me at the Castle the next time you are in Edinburgh, you will need to do alert me in advance so that I can clear you as a visitor through Historic Scotland.

80 YEARS ON ~ D DAY ~ 6 JUNE 1944

On 6 June the Colours of the Regiment are decked with a laurel wreath in recognition of the Battle Honour "NORTH WEST EUROPE 1944 – 45"


On the 23 June 1944 X Company the surviving unit of 4th Battalion Scots Guards was the first unit of the Regiment to cross the English Channel to Normandy with 3rd Bn Irish Guards as part of the Guards Armoured Division. They disembarked at the famous Mulberry Harbour at Arromanches. 28 June 32nd Guards Brigade including X Company entered the line for the first time 3 miles west of Caen.

A few weeks later 3SG part of the independent 6th Guards Tank Brigade, on the evening of 20 June and after a rough crossing 3SG mounted in heavy Churchill tanks disembarked on "Jig" Beach half a mile east of Arromanches.

3rd (Tank) Battalion Scots Guards first battle in Normandy was on 30 July, the assault on a long ridge, known usually as the Battle of Caumont, but for which the Battle Honour "QUARRY HILL" part of the ridge, was awarded.

both 1SG and S Company were in Italy involved in the fighting as "D Day Dodgers." After the capture of Rome on 6 June 1SG retraced its steps and passed through the city to cross the River Tiber. At the same time, S Company fighting with 2nd Battalion Coldstream Guards were following river valleys, firstly moving up the eastern bank of the River Tiber.

During World War 2 the Regiment was awarded 41 Battle Honours, 10 of them are borne on the Colours.

Lord Elgin

As Lt Lord Bruce he was badly wounded at the Battle of Caumont, Normandy in 1944 while serving with 3rd (Tank) Battalion Scots Guards at the Battle of Caumont.

In the past week he appeared in a TV documentary on the 80th Anniversary of D Day 1944.

Lord Elgin is a former President of the SGA Fife Branch.

On 24 April The Earl of Elgin KT, aged one hundred and a quarter, attended a lunch in Edinburgh at which he drank Champagne, White Burgundy, Vintage Claret and Port, thoroughly approving of all of them and much enjoying himself!

Ted Davidson

Ted Davidson served with the 3rd (Tank) Battalion Scots Guards during World War 2 from Normandy to VE Day 8 May 1945 in Germany, then beyond. He specifically served with the Forward Delivery Squadron. Ted was 98 years old in September 2023.

Ted lives in quiet retirement in Padiham, Burnley and is a member of SGA Preston.

80th ANNIVERSARY OF THE BATTLE OF MONTE CASSINO ~ EDINBURGH BLACKHALL ST COLUMBA'S CHURCH

In 1952 the then minister, Rev R.W. Watson Mathewson, brought the "Cross of Monte Cassino" to Blackhall St Columba's. The cross, which is of a simple wooden construction, was made for Mr Mathewson by a member of the Pioneer Corps while he was serving at Monte Cassino as a military chaplain part of the worship of Blackhall St Columba's ever since.

This was the third year that Blackhall St Columba's has held a special Service of Remembrance, to mark the occasion the Monte Cassino Society generously donated a memorial bench to be placed by the Blackhall War Memorial in the grounds of the church.

S Company that served under command of 2nd Bn Coldstream Guards.

Monte Cassino finally fell on 18th May 1944, but at a cost of an estimated 55,000 casualties. The German defenders are believed to have lost 20,000 dead or wounded during the battle, with a similar number of Italian civilians killed during the battle or in the air raids which destroyed the abbey and nearby town of Cassino. The town and abbey have since been rebuilt.
