

At the SGA AGM Major Cape gave his Welfare Officer's Update. He was given our thanks on behalf of the whole Regiment for his good work mainly in matters of welfare of our soldiers & families past and serving. Also remembering that his wider role entails looking after the day to day control of the Regimental finances, all for which we are grateful.

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31 MARCH 2024 - Key Welfare facts from this reporting period

This year we have provided benevolence grants to 72 Scots Guardsmen and their families totalling £115,440, with the exception of the previous year which included the winter fuel grant to all our Married LCpls and Gdsm is slightly above the 5-year average. The charity has given grants to the sum of £37,533.1 and sought assistance from 12 other charities who generously gave £77,906.9 in grants.





BRIAN WARD ~ AWARD OF SCOTS GUARDS CERTIFICATE

On Tuesday 23 April Major General Alastair Bruce OBE, VR, DL, Governor of Edinburgh Castle presented Brian Ward with a Scots Guards Certificate beside the famous "One 'o' Clock Gun.

General Bruce served with the 2nd Battalion Scots Guards from 1980 – 1983 in the Falkland Islands & Northern Ireland.

Brian is the Events Manager for the Royal British Legion (Scotland) ~ **Legion Scotland**, arranging such prestigious events as Edinburgh Remembrance Day Parade on the Royal Mile, Armed Forces Day in Edinburgh, The Garden of Remembrance Services in Glasgow, Edinburgh & Inverness. Currently he is working on the D-Day 80 Band Concert taking place at the Usher Hall Edinburgh on 6 June 2024.

From Legion Scotland HQ, alongside Poppy Scotland & the Poppy Factory at Logie Green Road, Edinburgh Brian also has an ear to the ground for Scots Guardsmen who require welfare assistance.

Historical Note

Ships in the Firth of Forth once set their maritime clocks by the One o'Clock Gun. The firing of the gun dates back to 1861, when businessman John Hewat brought the idea to Edinburgh from Paris. The gun is still fired every day at 1pm, except Sundays. Good Friday and Christmas. Crowds gather to enjoy the spectacle – and the sound often surprises people on Princes Street below. The original gun was a 64 pounder. Since 2001, a 105mm field gun has been fired from the Mills Mount Battery.

SCOTS GUARDS MEMORIAL PROJECT

A reminder that the Scots Guards Memorial Project is live on the Scots Guards website https://scotsguards.org/history/the-memorial-project/#, it is fairly easy to use. As part of the work of the Regimental Historical Committee the project was tasked with setting up a computer database to record memorials across the World that have been constructed to remember Scots Guardsmen in both war and peace. To date we currently have 380 Memorials listed and 927 Scots Guardsmen. We are looking for:

- Large or small memorials to single Scots Guardsmen, detachments or Battalions, from times long past until the present day.
- The memorial could be anything from plaques to stained glass windows in churches, to trees of remembrance, in fact anything which in the respectful memory of our officers or Guardsmen.
- The names of Scots Guardsmen killed and listed on local town or village war memorials.
- Headstones of graves in UK or abroad which record service in the Scots Guards, but please not those men buried in Commonwealth War Graves Commission Cemeteries because they are listed comprehensively by that organisation.




While you are out on your travels across the UK and beyond keep a look out for memorials to Scots Guardsmen from **Unusual** to **Colourful**:

The most unusual so far is an animal drinking trough & water fountain at Cuckfield in Sussex. Erected by their sister in the memory of Captain Charles Sergison and his brother (not SGs). Captain Sergison died at a relatively young age of 46 in 1911 after service during the Boer War.
