MAJOR WILLIAM INGLIS ~ CHAIRMAN ~ SCOTS GUARDS ASSOCIATION

On 1 October 2025 Major William Inglis took over as Chairman of the Scots Guards Association from Major Sir Malcolm MacGregor. We wish Major Willy Inglis well in the role.



William Inglis was commissioned into the Scots Guards in 1991, joining the Second Battalion in Hounslow. In 1992 he commanded a platoon of Scots Guards that was attached to the Welsh Guards for a tour of Northern Ireland, based in Ballykelly.

On returning to Edinburgh he was a Platoon Commander then Second in Command of Left Flank. After the Second Battalion was suspended, he moved to Windsor to join the First Battalion and was the Intelligence Officer for the tour of East Tyrone in 1994. He was subsequently on the staff of 24 Airmobile Brigade in Colchester, commanded the Guards Training Company in Catterick and Number 4 Company, Irish Guards in Munster from 2000-2002. He was then on the staff of 4 Armoured Brigade before returning to the 1st Battalion to command B Company in 2005 and finally Right Flank in 2006 when he left the army.

Subsequently he trained as a Chartered Surveyor, running estates on the island of Islay and then at Glamis. He is currently Head of National Estates for the National Trust for Scotland.

William is married to Charlotte and has two children who have now left home; he and Charlotte live in Coupar Angus, Scotland.


