Frank Remington Pretzman,

the younger son of W. Pretzman Esq^{re}, of Torquay, was born on February 17th, 1891. He was at Marlborough College (B.1.) from January 1906 to July 1907. After leaving Marlborough he studied mining Engineering, and became an Associate of the Royal School of Mines. He worked in Central and North America, and when the war was declared was attached to the Geological Survey of the State of Wisconsin.

In 1914 he enlisted as a despatch rider, and, after promotion to Sergeant, was given a Commission in the Royal Engineers in April 1915, and joined a Tunnelling Company. At this duty he was twice gassed underground, once in trying to save a Corporal's life. In July 1916 he transferred to the Scots Guards, and served with the 2nd Battⁿ until his death in Action near Ypres on July 4th, 1917, during the Concentration before the attack on the Pilkem Ridge.
