We now accept card payments!



## 3rd (TANK) BATTALION SCOTS GUARDS - NORMANDY MEMORIAL

This Newsletter reported last month about fund raising for a Memorial to the 3<sup>rd</sup> (Tank) Battalion Scots Guards. Donations have been made at the Rabbits Breakfast & at SGA Border Dinner. Various SGA Branches and other Regt Groups are also donating.

The Earl of Elgin who celebrated his 96<sup>th</sup> Birthday in February reminded me that he is one of the last officers from that illustrious Battalion still living. Another is Colonel Adrian Seymour who celebrated his 100<sup>th</sup> birthday on 11 June last year. He was 2ic HQ Sqn in Normandy and finished the war as Adjt of the Bn.

Captain Hew Balfour told me of 7 officers (including himself) who served in the Regiment who's fathers served in 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion.

6 Guards Tank Brigade's first action in Normandy in July 1944 was in support of 15th Scottish Division at the start of Operation BLUECOAT. There are two memorials in Normandy to the Coldstream Guards (both on Hill However, as yet, the 3rd Bn Scots Guards have no memorial. But we're looking to change A couple of years' ago, I mentioned to Stéphane Jacquet (the president of the Association TILLY 1944) & also involved in Operation Bluecoat - Musée de la "Percée du Bocage" museum that it would be a good idea if a memorial was erected to recognise 3Bn & their first day in action where S Squadron was badly mauled (to say the least) by Jaqgdpanthers of 654 sPzJAbt on their target of Hill226. Last June, I toured some of the possible sites with Stéphane and others to look at what was possible to achieve & the conclusion was that an attempt would be to not only erect a memorial stone, but also an Orientation Table to explain that part of Operation BLUECOAT. The aim is to have this erected in July to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of the action.

However, in order to make this a reality, it looks as though the first estimate (which we've asked to be confirmed) for the memorial we will need to raise E1,500. Achieving this, especially in this 75th Year, would be a fantastic memorial for those guys that served (and died) in 3rd Bn SG.

# 2701084 Gdsm John Shiells 3rd (Tank) Battalion Scots Guards

During the month I received an email from Piet Snellen a former Sgt in the Royal Dutch Signals. He told me that the locals of his village of Sevenum hope to unveil a Memorial to Gdsm John Shiells. The story is that on 21 November 1944 LSgt Brown's Churchill Tank of the Recce Troop hit a mine in the village and the driver Gdsm Shiells was killed. He was buried in the street of Sevenum where he fell and until August 1947 his grave was tended by a widow Mrs Ida Pauwels who was a simple peasant woman. In 1947 his remains were moved to Mook War Cemetery. On 22 November 2019 the village of Sevenum hope to unveil a Memorial to both Guardsman John Shiells and Mrs Ida Pauwels.
