#### **TUESDAY 14 JUNE 2022**

The ticket application process arranged by the Royal British Legion is that all Scots Guards Falklands Veterans wishing to attend this National Commemoration should apply to Neil Crockett by email <a href="mailto:sga@scotsguards.org">sga@scotsguards.org</a> whether they are a member of the Scots Guards Association or not.

Some veterans have already applied, the ticket application is logged and you will receive by email a form to fill in and a reference number. E-tickets will be sent out approx mid May.

Falkland veterans can apply for themselves and one guest. There is an online ticket application process and you need to be accredited. Those who so far applied have found it very easy, you are registered and eTickets will be sent out about 28 days before 14 June.

Members of our bereaved families can also apply for themselves and one guest, the application process is slightly different but they should contact Neil Crockett for details. **If you have contact details for any of our bereaved families please pass on this information**.

You can apply for tickets until 29 April, but sooner the better so you can make your plans for the day.

On the 14 June there will be access to the National Arboretum in the morning, there will be an exhibition and opportunity personal acts of remembrance. 1230 - 1330hrs refreshments will available.

At 1330hrs the UK National Commemoration will take place at the Armed Forces Memorial and it will include royalty, politicians, etc. when only official wreaths will be laid. At the end of the commemoration individuals will be able to lay their own wreath if they wish to.

The general public will be able to apply for tickets later in process and this will include veterans who didn't serve in Falklands.

On completion of the benediction and as mourners reassembled for the walk back to the house the pipers played the jig Major Nickerson's Fancy. #### SERVING UPDATE

#### 1st Battalion Update



The main focus for the Battalion throughout the Winter of 2022 was Military Assistance to Civilian Authorities (MACA) Tasks. - Members of the Sgts Mess have been successful on the RMAS CSgt Instructor Cadre Course.





#### **Bite Size - Regimental History**

At the Borders Branch Dinner I was handed various photographs and documents by Eck Barclay to be passed on to the Regimental Historical Committee, C/O Regimental Headquarters. These items came from the family of the late Guardsman Fred Webb (former Branch Secretary). Fred enlisted and served throughout the 2<sup>nd</sup> World War in 3<sup>rd</sup> (Tank) Battalion Scots Guards. He was orderly to Major Charles Farrell initially in Left Flank and subsequently in S Squadron when he drove the water truck from Normandy to the Baltic. It was a job that made him many friends, not least because other than the water he brought up the mail and cigarettes.

The photographs included 3 groups from 3SG, a copy of the programme of Gds Armoured Farewell to Armour Parade, a few copies of the Bn post war newsletters called "Sempar Paratus" - the Bn motto "Ever Ready". This includes the final copy before the Bn was disbanded in early February 1946. It included a letter from my late father in law Donald Fraser who was then Regimental Sergeant Major for the final 15 weeks before 3SG disbanded.



# GUARDS ARMOURED DIVISION

September 1941 - June 1945

The Guards Armoured Division was formed in the summer of 1941 as a direct result of the expected German invasion of Great Britain, and assembled in September around Warminster. Originally 6 Guards Armoured Brigade was included in the Division but it later became an Independent Tank Brigade. Most of the units and Services have been with the Division since the beginning, including the Leicestershire Yeomanry and 21 Anti Tank Regiment which are now leaving.

After prolonged training on Salisbury Plain, in Norfolk, and on the Yorkshire Wolds, the Guards Armoured Division landed in France last June and it had months of hard fighting in the Normandy bridgehead. The Division then consider the River Seine and took part in the sensational advance through Belgium Holland, completing then the most rapid advance of a Division in history—Doual to Brussels, 97 miles, in 14 hours.

Units of the Division were first of the Allied ground forces to enter Holland Germany, for it was a patrol of 21 Anti Tank Regiment that crossed the German frontier on the 21 September 1944.

During the Winter and early Spring, the Division was busily engaged in and then on 30 March it crossed the River Rhine finally ending up at During this last advance of some 400 miles the Divisional Sappers to less than 50 bridges.

Grards Armoured Brigade, which is now welcomed back into the Division, much hard fighting in the Normandy bridgehead and throughout tangent has supported a dozen different divisions in battle. It was in the different divisions in battle. It was in the different divisions and on one occasion the tanks completed 66 miles in seven hours.

TO THE EDITOR
"WEEKLY BULLETIN"
Sir

Before the great traditions of this Battalion are laid to rest in Immortal history and the men, wo helped to forge them are transferred to other Battalions of the Regiment or depart for Civilian life I would like to say that some 15 weeks ago I had the great honour of becoming your Regimental Sergeant Major and would like to express my deepest appreciation to all ranks for the grand co-operation and loyally given to me throughout this regrettably short period.

During my tour of duty with you I have discovered a wonderful atmosphere of "Esprit de Corps" which has and must have made this Battalion the fine Unit it has proved itself to be.

To those of you who are going to other Battalions of the Regiment I say "Carry with you the great Spirit of the 3rd Battalion" and to those returning to Civilian life "Remember once a Scots Guardsman always a Scots Guardsman" a 3rd Battalion Scots Guardsman".

The very best of luck to you all.

466 GERMANY: 1945-1946

was held in the garden of the Officers' Mess, at which General Marriott addressed the Battalion, recalled its past services, and wished all ranks God-speed. "As to your conduct in battle," said General Marriott, "your Brigade Commander, Brigadier Douglas Greenacre, knows far more than I do . . . but I believe he looked upon you as the best Battalion in his Brigade—a Brigade which never failed the Infantry to whom it was allotted, and especially the 15th Scottish Division who have shown by various presentations their great appreciation of your worth."

The Battalions now dispersed. Eight officers, Regimental Sergeant-Major Brown and 330 other ranks went to Trieste and the First Battalion; to the Second Battalion at Wipperfürth went four officers and 120 rank and file. By the end of the month a bare hundred were left at Weiden, but this hundred included the Battalion's famous football team, captained by Guardsman Girdwood; it had beaten the Second Battalion in an epic final for the championship of the Guards Division, and it penetrated to the semi-finals of the Army Championships. In the scramble between the Regular Battalions for the assets of the Third, none was more coveted than these eleven men! The military duties were all handed over to Belgian troops, and on the 28th February the Third Battalion was formally disbanded.

Regt History 1919 – 1955 – 3SG Disbands and men are dispersed to 1SG – Trieste, Italy. 2SG – Wipperfurth, Germany & to demob.

Let another extract from Field Marshal Montgomery's Rotenburg speech serve as the epitaph of this Battalion—and of all the Battalions which fought in the Guards Armoured Division and in the 6th Guards Tank Brigade.

"I want to say, here and now, that in the sphere of armoured warfare the Guards have set a standard that it will be difficult for those that come after to reach.

"In modern war it is the co-operation of all arms, armoured and unarmoured, that wins the battle, and in this respect you have achieved great results. In fact, the Guards have shown that whatever they are asked to do—whatever they take on—they do well: maintaining always the highest standards and giving a lead to all others. You will long be remembered for your prowess in armoured war."

Field Marshal Montgomery - "You will be long remembered for your prowess in armoured war".
