The November Newsletter reported the death of Lieutenant Colonel Duncan Beat, former Director of Music to the Regimental Band. I received the following from Pipers Branch Secretary, Dougie Watson who in turn had received a report from Roger Huth (Former Pipe Major).

**Dougie:** You will recall a recent post intimating the passing of Lieutenant Colonel D R Beat LVO ARCM who was Director of Music Scots Guards Regimental Band.....many a SG's Piper will have played The Soldiers Return which he had included in his musical arrangement "Edinburgh Castle." It was a staple throughout my service and since and has a stirring intro for the pipers to come in on.

**Roger** "I was booked to play at a funeral in Mortlake Crematorium in Richmond today (3rd November 2022) and while I sat in the car park watching the rain I happened to see a handful of Guards Musicians heading towards the Chapel bearing their brass instruments. Curiosity made me reach for my binoculars and when I saw the red and white dice on their forage caps I donned my brogues and headed over to listen. I expected to see a Guards tie or two but only black ties were in wear from mourners gathering nearby. The musicians had disappeared.

I headed back to the car then realised I hadn't checked the list of today's Services so went back to do so. The Service preceding mine and now taking place was for the late Lieutenant Colonel Duncan R. Beat who I and many of our pipers here will surely know.

When the Chapel Director saw me kilted up and watching the Service from outside the glass doors she whispered "You're for the Service at twelve o'clock"

After I explained that I had served with Duncan Beat she promptly gave me his Order of Service so I could follow proceedings and enjoy Duncan Beat's 'Edinburgh Castle' music from the Scots Guards Brass Quintet and also 'The Swan' by Saint Saens played on Cello by Jessica

Sadly, I had to miss Duncan Beat's 'Fanfare For Four Trumpets' and 'The Aberdonian' plus the Last Post as I was now on duty for the next Funeral Service.

However I was very pleased to have accidently been in the right place at the right time to see and hear what I could"

Fortuitous to bump into Col. Rory Shannon at Gatwick Airport for some final pearls of wisdom. Col. Shannon successfully crossed the Atlantic in 2001 also representing the Scots Guards ~ Next stop La Gomera!

In December 2022, these four soldiers will attempt to win the Talisker Whisky Atlantic Challenge – without a doubt the world's toughest rowing race.

They are all serving members of the Scots Guards and have come together based on their aspiration to champion mental health and resilience. Rowing on the 40th anniversary of the Falklands Conflict, we aim to commemorate the sacrifices made in 1982 and successfully raise over £100,000 in support of our chosen mental health and wellbeing charities. A strong team bond, along with a clear understanding of our aim, will be critical as we embark on one of the ultimate tests of physical and mental fortitude; battling 30+ foot waves, cramped sleeping quarters, sleep deprivation and physical exhaustion whilst rowing 3000 miles across the Atlantic Ocean.

The team starts the challenge in around 12 days time from La Gomera, Canary Islands ~ 3000 miles later they will arrive at English Harbour, Antigua.
