Third Guards Club, London Branch & Surrey Branch

Captain David James Archibald. Died 11 June 2021

Enlisted as a Junior Guardsman in Pirbright in 1966.

Served in both Battalions plus a tour in Headquarters 4 Guards Armoured Brigade. Saw service in Sharjah, Kenya, Northern Ireland, Germany and in the Falkland Islands.

Served three tours of duty at Regimental Headquarters. The first as a Lance Sergeant, then as Superintending Clerk from 1983 to 1986 and Assistant Regimental Adjutant upon commissioning from 1987 to 1991.

He also spent a period of time in the Office of The Prince of Wales.

He was a very active and hugely influential member of the Regimental Historical Committee for many years and an extremely good mounter and framer of medals and pictures.
