NEWS FROM 1st BN SCOTS GUARDS

The Battalion has been extremely busy as it builds on the strong foundation of infantry skills it developed in Belize on Exercise Mayan Storm. The Companies have been away doing a myriad of different exercises. Overarching all the individual Company tasks is the Battalion resubordinating to 20X which will provide a host of new and exciting opportunities. Furthermore, the Battalion has assumed part of the role of the UK Standby Battalion (UKSB) thus being able to, on top of everything else, be able to provide service men and women to help civil authorities at short notice.

Right Flank is currently the enabling Company, providing training and support to the rest of the Battalion. The Training wing continues to provide rigorous and austere training to the Battalion including pre-cadres for Junior non-commissioned Officers to ensure that they are best prepared for their promotion courses. They are also building up our night-firing ability with complex and demanding night ranges planned. There is a right flank platoon out in the Falkland Islands which will be there for the 40th anniversary of the assault on Mount Tumbledown by the 2nd Battalion.

B Company have deployed to Poland on Exercise Defender 22 with the Kings Royal Hussars Battlegroup. They have formed a dedicated anti-tank Company that was truly put to the test out in Poland. The exercise and capability were a resounding success. They are, concurrently, preparing for deployment, later in the year, to Estonia on Operation CABRIT.

C Company have continued to build and develop their readiness capability as they will be providing the bulk of the mass for the Battalion's contribution to the UKSB commitment. They are, concurrently, training and preparing for exciting training opportunities later in the year.

HQ Company, as ever, is working hard to facilitate all the great training and opportunities that are ongoing within the Battalion.

Left Flank have recently returned from Cyprus where they conducted the self-generated exercise Tartan Sun to prepare for their alignment to Op Orbital. The potential for different forms this commitment might take necessitated a demanding and varied exercise. They have returned from this and are now ensuring they continue to be in the best place possible to be able to go anywhere or do anything.

Miscellaneous

A team from the Scots Guards has successfully summited Mount Denali, the highest peak in North America, which is a fantastic achievement. One of the team was Sgt Clarke who is to start at the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst in September. He will join no less than six CSgt Instructors already at the academy from the Scots Guards. This is an immense reflection of the superlative quality of the Senior Non Commissioned Officers within the Scots Guards.

PROVISION OF INFORMATION FROM THE SCOTS GUARDS ARCHIVES WEF 29 NOVEMBER 2021

Introduction

The Regimental Lieutenant Colonel, with the concurrence of the Chairman of The Scots Guards Charity, has made the following direction, to take immediate effect, with regard to the provision of information from the Scots Guards Archives about individual officers and soldiers.

Future arrangements for provision of information free of charge

Subject to data protection regulations, information about individual members of the Regiment will be provided free of charge if the applicant is:

The individual concerned

Wife/Partner/Widow of the individual

Sibling of the individual

Father or mother of the individual

Son or daughter of the individual

Applicants are requested to provide the Archives NCO with as much information as they can about the individual concerned and to note that, in the event that they are unable to provide a soldier's regimental number, it may not be possible to provide any information. Provision of a regimental number is not applicable to officers.

Future arrangements for provision of information in all other cases

In all other cases, but subject to data protection regulations, information about individual members of the Regiment will be provided on payment by the applicant of a non-returnable £30 fee for each individual enquiry [i.e. for each file requested], to be paid to The Scots Guards Charity in advance.

Applicants are asked to note that all fees received are gratefully appreciated and applied to the conservation and enhancement of the Archives.

Applicants are requested to provide the Archives NCO with as much information as they can about the individual concerned and to note that, in the event that they are unable to provide a soldier's regimental number, it may not be possible to provide any information. Provision of a regimental number is not applicable to officers.

Before they apply on a paying basis the attention of prospective applicants is drawn to the availability on the Findmypast genealogy website of all available Scots Guards officers and soldiers records up to 1938 commissioning or enlistment. The main purposes of the contract between The Scots Guards Charity and Findmypast were to make this information readily available publicly and to reduce the handling of archive material. Under the contract Findmypast makes royalty payments to The Scots Guards Charity.
