Captain David Ronald Stuart Menzies of Menzies. Died 27 April 2023 age 88. Enlisted on National Service 1953, Commissioned August 1954. Served 1SG 1954 to 1958, with K Coy and as ADC to Governor General

Western Australia to 1961.

Captain Peter Richard Hill. Died April 2023 age 84. Commissioned 1960 Served 1SG & 2SG BAOR, Aden & East Africa to April 1965

Captain Peter David Atholl Copeland. Died May 2023 age 87. Enlisted 1954, Commissioned July 1956 to 1SG BAOR to July 1961.

Captain NA (Alan) Young. Died 13 May 2023 the day before his 75 birthday. Lived Lancaster.

Alan enlisted in 1965 and joined 2SG, most of his early service was in the Anti Tanks Pltn. He served as a LSgt in S Company, British Honduras in 1971. He came across to 1SG about 1978 firstly in the Training Office and then as a well respected CSM of Left Flank in Chelsea, Kenya and Aldergrove 1980 – 81 and early Hong Kong 1982. He was then DSgt for much of Hong Kong and Pirbright 1984. He returned to Hong Kong as Garrison Sergeant Major at HMS Tamar. On commissioning he was first Families Officer 1SG at Hohne, he served in the Gulf 1991, then as Warrior Company Gunnery Officer and later he was at Armoured Infantry Training & Advisory Team, Sennelager, serving to around 1994.

Sadly his wife Maisie deceased him as did his eldest son Bobby who died earlier this year.

The funeral will take place a Lancaster Crematorium on Friday 2 June 2023 at 1430hrs.

SERVING REGIMENT - UPDATE: 1St BATTALION & F COMPANY

Since the last Battalion update there have been four key events: The return of B Company in Estonia, C Company in the Falklands, with the remainder in Kenya and then the rapid turnaround to get those taking part in Operation GOLDEN ORB ready!!

Firstly, B Company were entirely restored to the UK by the end of March having had an immensely successful Op CABRIT tour in Estonia as part of the NATO Enhanced Forward Presence. They formed the first dedicated Anti-Tank Company since the 2nd World War attached to the Kings Royal Hussars Battlegroup. They took part in numerous exercises in the harsh Estonian winter with a host of other nations where they really excelled and ensured that the professional excellence and standards of the Scots Guards that are famous in the UK became internationally renowned!

C Company deployed to the Falklands on Op FIRIC where they too were subjected to some wonderful cold weather. They spent time on the feared Onion Ranges and experienced the infamous 'four seasons in a day' climate. Nevertheless they did some fantastic looking training as well as the important Battlefield Study up Mt Tumbledown which the 2nd Battalion famously fought its way up during the Falklands War.

The remainder of the Battalion deployed to Kenya as Task Force Hannibal, playing enemy for the Coldstream Guards for their validation exercise: Exercise Askari Storm. This was a fantastic opportunity to get some good honest (and sometimes not so honest) soldiering in without the pressure of validation looming over our heads. It was a really useful runout for the Headquarters who were able to get used to planning as a team as well as the troops who were able to stretch their legs on the harsh terrain on offer. Dodging elephants and buffalo on the way to objectives and charging around the Savannah in 'Mutatus' (a sort of schoolbus type vehicle) in order to defeat our enemy offered both unique challenges and freedoms. We also got to do some cracking Adventure Training and just enjoy some time in a beautiful country.

After all this, as you can imagine, the turnaround to get everyone ready for GOLDEN ORB was extremely difficult. With very little leave between Kenya and the start of training everyone was certainly tired and a bit drained but, as you will no doubt have seen, cracked on and put on an amazing show. The training consisted of long days on the square and then plenty of polishing and ironing in the evening to stay on top of kit but it was all worth it.

Marching in Columns 10 deep was a spectacle that the nation should not soon forget and it was a unique opportunity for the Regiment to be a real part of history and, again, demonstrate its ability to provide excellence in all things. It is a testament to every member of the Scots Guards and those attached that so much is able to get done in such a short period of time and then turn it all around to produce such a spectacular.





The inside story of the first Lay Commissioner appointed to deal with public grievances against the legal profession

Michael Scott's MINDING THE LAW: The hazardous and hilarious world of handling complaints against barristers will be published on 7 June 2023

Michael Scott left the Army aged 55 to become the first Lay Commissioner to deal with the public's complaints against the legal profession. He had no experience of the law but his years in the military gave him invaluable insights that helped him handle grievances from murderers, gangsters, drug barons, paedophiles, bitter divorces and infuriated neighbours. In doing so, he weathered criticism, threats, vilification – and occasional appreciation.

Michael Scott led the Second Battalion Scots Guards in the Falklands War and was awarded a DSO. He was a brigade commander in Northern Ireland, and as a Major General he commanded the Army in Scotland.

Michael Scott is an experienced speaker and is available for interview to discuss his book and issues currently very much in the news: amongst them the question of starting again for those whom the government wants to be "unretired," and the eternal problem of how members of the public deal with complaints against the powerful institutions of the law.
