



There is limited Car Parking in Barracks entrance via Petty France and follow instructions from Guardroom & SG parking guides. You are asked not to arrive by car if possible.

After the service the parade will form up on the Barrack Square in 6s. The Regimental Lieutenant Colonel will command the parade to the Guards Memorial where there will be a short service of wreath laying, marching back to Barracks, a salute will be taken just before re-entering Barracks. The parade will be dismissed.

80 YEARS AGO ON SUNDAY MORNING 18 JUNE 1944 THE GUARDS CHAPEL WAS DESTROYED

At a quarter past eleven on the morning of Sunday 18th June 1944 a jet-propelled flying bomb (the German V.1) dived onto the Guards' Chapel when it was full of worshippers. By great good fortune the congregation on that Sunday was the smallest it had been for many months.

The chapel was hit by a flying bomb which entered at the western end and exploded, killing 121 soldiers and civilians, including Scots Guardsmen, Lieutenant-Colonel J. M. Cobbold, Lieutenant H. W. Dods, Second-Lieutenant J. A. G. Duberly and two other ranks were among those killed.


the Director of Music and five musicians from the Band of the Coldstream Guards. 141 others were seriously wounded.

Tons of rubble fell on the congregation. The chapel was completely destroyed with the exception of the apse, but the six silver candlesticks were unmoved by the explosion and the candles remained burning.

As clouds of dust subsided, first aid teams and heavy rescue crews arrived to find a scene of utter devastation. The initial City of Westminster ARP assessment put the number of casualties at 400 -500. At first the debris appeared impenetrable, the doors to the Chapel were blocked. The recue services and Guardsmen from the barracks immediately began freeing survivors from the wreckage. The operation to free them all took 48 hours.

The incident was the most serious V1 attack on London during the war.

Despite wartime restrictions, a temporary chapel was erected in a Romney Hut attached to the undamaged apse and this was used .interior is light with big slit windows and regimental standards all around.



Using the memorials from the old chapel as foundations, a new chapel was built in a Modernist style in 1963. The only remaining structure from the original church; the apse is preserved with its intensely coloured mosaics. In 1970 the building was made Grade II listed building. The Flanders Fields Memorial Garden dedicated to the memory of Guardsmen lost in the 1st World War was opened by Queen Elizabeth II in 2014 and occupies land next to the chapel.



Free of financial obligation to support a spouse of family (we do not accept applications from individuals who are currently married, in a civil partnership or have children under 18 yrs. old).

Able to live independently in our Long Ward accommodation. We don't accept applications from those who currently require residential or nursing care.

Apply for an armed forces veteran card to prove that you served in the UK armed forces.

When you apply, you'll be asked for:

- your service number for your last period of service
- your National Insurance number
- the approximate year you started and ended your service it does not have to be exact
- a recent <u>digital passport style photo</u>, showing your head and shoulders

TALKING OF VETERANS ~ IN THIS CASE A REAL OLD SOLDIER

Earlier this month I received an email from Jan Timmer in Utrecht, Netherlands telling me as a hobby he paints portraits of remarkable individuals he finds in photographs etc. Below is his painting of CSgt William McGregor from a photograph taken in 1856 after the Crimea War.



He asked for some information about CSgt William McGregor

- At the time of the war in the Crimea the title of the Regiment was the Scots Fusilier Guards.
- You can Google this man and you will find the photograph Jan Timmer took his painting from.
- William McGregor's military number was 2404. He served in 1st Battalion Scots Fusilier Guards.
- Although the title of photograph describes him as Sergeant he was in fact a Colour Sergeant.

His service is:

- Date of Birth 1821
- He enlisted on 6 February 1839 aged 18 years and 2 months. At the time he was living at Hunting Tower, Perth. This is a small area, just to the west of the City of Perth not far from St Johnstone's football ground.
- He was a Sergeant from 1 April 1846 7 July 1853.
- He was a Colour Sergeant 8 July 1953 7 February 1860 when he was discharged at the age of 39 years & 2 months. He served 21 Years. His tunic rank badge is the same as is worn today.
- The Battle of the Alma was 20 September 1854 when he was wounded.
- His medals are: The British Crimea War Medal & The Order of the Medjidie Turkish Medal.
- The British Crimea War Medal looks as though it has 3 clasps (bars) on denoting the battles he fought in. 1) The Alma 2) Inkerman 3) Sevastopol . These are Scots Guards Battle Honours and shown on our Colours.
- Because he was discharged aged 39 there is no indication if he returned to Perthshire or when he died.
