DEATHS

MEMORIAL SERVICE - BRUCE INNES.

As reported Bruce Innes died on 25 May 2022 and his funeral took place in West Lothian A Memorial Service will take place at Aldermaston Recreation and Social Club, Berkshire on Friday 11 November 2022. THIRD GUARDS CLUB

Captain Sir Edward Jeremy Westrow Hulse Bt Died. Age 89. After Eton he attended the Guards Depot and the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst from 10 April 1951 to 5 February 1953. He was commissioned into the Regiment on 6 February 1953. He served as a platoon commander and as anti-tank platoon commander in both the First and Second Battalions to February 1958.

Lieutenant Colonel Sir Simon Claud Michael Bland KCVO . Died 11th August 2022. Age 98. After Eton he up on 6 August 1942 and was commissioned into the First Battalion in Italy on 8 October 1944. Served both Bns Simon served as a Company Commander during the Malaya Emergency in 1949/50. He was a Company Commander in Germany from 1953 to 1957 and at ERE including as an ADC in Washington from 1947-59. He retired from the Army in the rank of Lieutenant Colonel on 3 December 1978. He was the assistant military adviser to the High Commission in Karachi from 1959 – 1960 and in 1961 appointed assistant private secretary to Prince Henry, Duke of Gloucester. He went on to be Private Secretary to Prince William of Gloucester from 1968 to 1972 and to Richard, Duke of Gloucester until his retirement in 1989. He was made a Knight Commander in the Royal Victorian Order in 1982.

Captain George Herbert Lorne Campbell. Died 21 August 2022. He attended Eaton Hall from 13 April 1953 and then the Guards Training Battalion until 16 July 1954. Second Battalion in BAOR and then moved on to the First Battalion on 20 January 1955. From April 1962 to February 1963, he was ADC to Major General Claude Dunbar in Berlin, during a time of high tension. He held a number of appointments in both Battalions over his twelve years of commissioned service including a considerable time in Africa.

Lieutenant George Archibald Crawford. Died 9 August 2022. Age 82. He was commissioned and served in 2SG from March 1959 to March 1962.

WORLD WAR 2 SCOTS GUARDS VETERANS

On 8 May 2020 we commemorated VE Day75 when the then Regimental Lieutenant Colonel, Brigadier Nickerson wrote to our known WW2 Veterans to thank them for their service. Sadly on VE Day75 neither of these fine Scots Guardsmen were known to us.

2702312 LSgt James Beard Died 19 June 2022. Aged 96. Served 1944 - No2 Gds Training Bn 1946. Lived Stafford.

Gdsm Joseph Gemmell Died 6 July 2022 Age 97. Served 3SG 1943 – 1947. Lived Long Island New York.

Joseph was a Guardsmen in the 6th Guards Tank Brigade in World War II. He was enlisted into the Army on his Birthday a June the 8th, 1943. He was taken into the Scots Guards and then trained as a Tank Driver and served with the 6th Guards Tank Brigade from the Normandy invasion through the end of the war and after during its occupation being discharged in 1947.

Major DHA Kemble MC and L/Sgt CS Melville

Two members of the Highlands & Islands Branch, Major Cammy Proudfoot and Roddy Davidson, quite independently came across the new Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC) plaque on the gate to the Dores Cemetery just outside Inverness, particularly Scots Guards Military Cross holder, Acting Lt Col David Horace Abercromby Kemble MC.







A quick look at the CWGC website gave his rank as Major and his date of death as 6th April 1945 rather than 22nd May 1944, and The Oracle (aka Neil Crockett) confirmed his date of death as 6th April 1945 and that he was an Acting Major, so the details on the CWGC plaque are a mystery. Major Kemble was son of Captain Horace L Kemble, MVO, who had also served in the Scots Guards, and Nina Kemble of Laggan, Inverness-shire. Major Kemble was clearly strong and brave and a great leader who continued his loyal service to the end.

He served with the African Rifles, and it was with them in the Ethiopian Campaign that he was awarded his Military Cross in 1941. He was 2SG HQ Company Commander at the Battle of Medenine, Tunisia in March 1942. In March 1943 whilst serving with the battalion in North Africa he lost an eye, but he continued to command his company. He was then killed, aged 31, on 6th April 1945 by a burst of Spandau fire whilst commanding 2SG F Company, which was at the head of a multi-regiment and international force in the final push against the German defences in the area east of the Rhine and particularly Bremen. Unsurprisingly, he gets 12 mentions in the 1919-1955 regimental history.

He is buried at the Sage War Cemetery, near Bremen, alongside 6 other courageous, loyal Scots Guardsmen killed in the same action: L/Cpl Gray (Clydebank, married, aged 24), Gdsm Dennis George Robertson (19), Gdsm William Houston (23) and L/Sgt's William Wilson (Kinghorn, 23), Gerrard White (22) and Cathel Sutherland Melville (30) of Castletown, Golspie, married with a son, pictured with his family on leave. He is remembered on Golspie War Memorial.

Digging further, LSgt Melville was, like Major Proudfoot, from Golspie. Sgt Melville as a butcher to trade and a keen footballer, playing for several Sutherland teams. Whilst serving he was in the Pirbright Camp team playing Aldershot Services which was a team of professional players recruited by the army as instructors which included CSMI Matt Busby (Liverpool) and team captain QMSI Joe Mercer Everton).



Pirbright Camp are on the right of this photo and Sgt Melville is 2nd from the left in the front row. Matt Busby is 2nd from the left in the middle row of the left of this photo. Joe Mercer is 4th from the left in the front row. The other professionals played for Bournemouth, Wolves, Rangers, Airdrieonians, Sheffield Wednesday, Stockport and Everton, so a formidable team of professionals for Sgt Melville and his fellow amateurs to contend with.



LSgt Melville with his family on leave. His wife Joey lived onto 2002, his son David died in 2000, with both of them still living in Castletown until their passing.

Finally, another of the Pirbright Camp team was a Gdsm Gallacher, it doesn't identify which Guards Regiment he served with, but through another branch member, Davy MacKenzie, we have made the first contact with Scots Guards Afghan veteran Stuart (Gal) Gallacher now living in Inverness, who hopefully will become part of the branch.

The current members of the Highlands & Islands Branch are proud to follow in the footsteps of these courageous men who gave their all for our country.

During World War 2 on 18 March 1942 the Regiment celebrated the 300th Anniversary

Imagine this, in just 20 years time the Regiment will be holding a 400th Anniversary Parade - if it's anything like the 350th anniversary at Holyrood Palace on 24 June 1992 it will be forever remembered.



The 350th Parade formed up with a detachment from the 1st Battalion (in combat kit & serving in Northern Ireland) the 2nd Battalion (in HSC), those Extra Regimentally Employed, The Third Guards Club and Scots Guards Association.

POEM TO COMMEMORATE THE 350th ANNIVERSARY OF THE SCOTS GUARDS — 1642/1992
