1ST BATTALION SCOTS GUARDS NEWS

As the Battalion awaits flights to the Oman Captain Tom Gordon, Intelligence Officer takes time out to give an update:

It is normal practice for the Battalion update to start with a comment such as 'it has been an extremely busy period for the Scots Guards' however, and I must admit thankfully, this period has been somewhat restful. In the June edition it was remarked that the Battalion had returned straight from Kenya and smashing the Coldstream Guards onto the drill square for the King's Coronation. Furthermore, at the time of writing we are merely days out from the Main Body flights to start going to Oman where the majority of the Battalion will be spending the next few months. Therefore, I feel not guilt in remarking on a somewhat restful period enjoying the one or two days of summer-like weather that we apparently had.

The Battalion went on leave at the end of July which was very much needed but the two months prior to that were spent really setting the conditions for Oman in a way that simultaneously allowed us to recover from the rigours of earlier in the year. Much of this involved vehicle preparation and maintenance and low level training. Of particular note was a Pre-Cadre run by our genuinely fantastic training wing. This cadre lasted several weeks and had everyone from Guardsmen to Section Commanders on it preparing them for their relevant promotional courses. This included lessons on the Orders Process, Fieldcraft as well as a healthy amount of PT! This should ensure that those we choose to attend these promotional courses and, in the future, become the leaders within the Battalion are best prepared and of the highest quality.

On a less 'green' note, plenty of sport has been played including the Battalion Football team playing several fixtures as well as the Cricket Team including the annual Officers vs Sergeants fixture which, as one can imagine, is a game of cricket of the highest standard. Headquarter Company Commander also led a fantastic three week Adventure Training package to Scotland where they spent time on the water Kayaking as well as Mountain Biking and Hillwalking.

Of particular note was the Inter-Company Pace-Sticking competition which was fantastic to see. Organised by the Sergeant Major it was a great day with a BBQ provided by our excellent attached Chefs. Overall it has been a restful yet productive period for the Battalion allowing us to rest and recuperate while also preparing for a busy but hopefully fantastic three months in Oman following which the Scots Guards Association may receive a slightly more action-packed update!



Gavin Dickson Army Scripture Reader Colchester Garrison, Woodbridge and Wattisham Flying Station

Since leaving the Scots Guards in 2013, I have become an Army Scripture Reader. I distinctly remember removing my Scots Guards buttons and shoulder titles and replacing them with plain buttons and red Scripture Reader shoulder titles with tears in my eyes. However, I have the privilege to wear my Scots Guard beret still, be it uniquely, with a scripture reader cap badge. Since leaving the battalion, I have moved around a lot. Edinburgh, Catterick, Paderborn in Germany, back to Edinburgh and now in Colchester. Here in Colchester, I have the joy of entering the camps and providing pastoral support to those serving within 16 Air Assault, the Army Air Corps, and the Military Corrective Training Centre.

Having become a Christian while serving in the 1st Battalion, I quickly developed a deep concern for soldiers and their spiritual welfare; knowing God's forgiveness and love through Jesus Christ spurs me to share the same love and care of my saviour with fellow soldiers.

In both the field army and in MCTC, I seek to support soldiers and their families, often taking the form of conversation, helping when things are tough and seeking 'to befriend soldiers and Aviators in light of their spiritual welfare, providing them with a Christian example, and to support the moral component of the fighting force. How I do this takes many forms, from hosting Bible studies to leading Christian worship in the Garrison church and MCTC on Sundays, being a listening ear, and assisting the unit welfare teams and the Army Welfare Service. I have the joy of supporting the three local schools that teach military children with School Assemblies and provide support in building resilience in relationships with courses and activities aimed at military families. Of course, without the support of my wife, Pauline and our two boys, Malachi, nine and Harvey, eight, who have willingly travelled with me, I would not be able to do any of this—especially my wife, who puts up with me and the demands of ministry life.
